Preface

Introduction

Vitrium Systems' protectedpdf solution allows you to distribute PDF documents securely. Readers can unlock protectedpdf documents by filling in a form built into the protectedpdf file.

Protectedpdf documents can be used for secure distribution of documents where readers enter credentials such as email address and password prior to gaining access to protected pages in the document. Alternatively, protectedpdf can be used to conduct market research activities by having readers fill in a survey prior to allowing them access to the document. In this case, there are no pre-established credentials such as a username and password; instead the reader is presented with a form on the document cover page which they are required to complete prior to gaining access to the document's protected pages.

This document describes in detail how you integrate and extend your publishing pipeline to include support for all documents in the protectedpdf suite. This allows you to seamlessly add Rights Management to PDF documents and control access to documents based on any criteria you choose.

Audience

This document is intended for users familiar with object oriented programming and web services using SOAP. The intended audience includes document publishers who wish to automate the process of creating and managing protectedpdf documents.

This document describes protectedpdf objects in Visual Basic.NET, C#.NET and Java.

Knowledge of Adobe Acrobat and familiarity with the PDF file format is helpful but not required.
